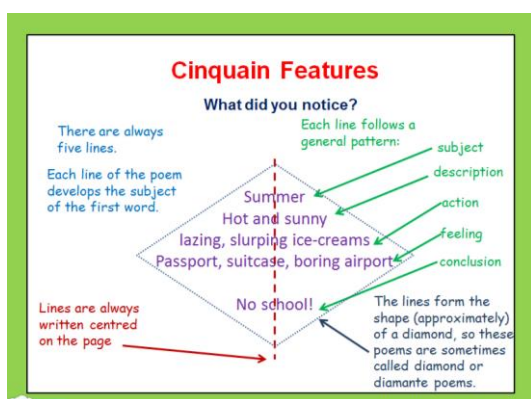




Welcome to Year 5D's class newsletter.

Literacy

Numeracy

We have been extremely busy in maths over the past 2 weeks. We have been practising different written methods to multiply 3 digit numbers by a single digit number. We have also been recognising multiplies of a given number, finding all the prime numbers to 100, finding equivalent fractions and comparing fractions as well as converting litres into millilitres and grams into kilogram's.
